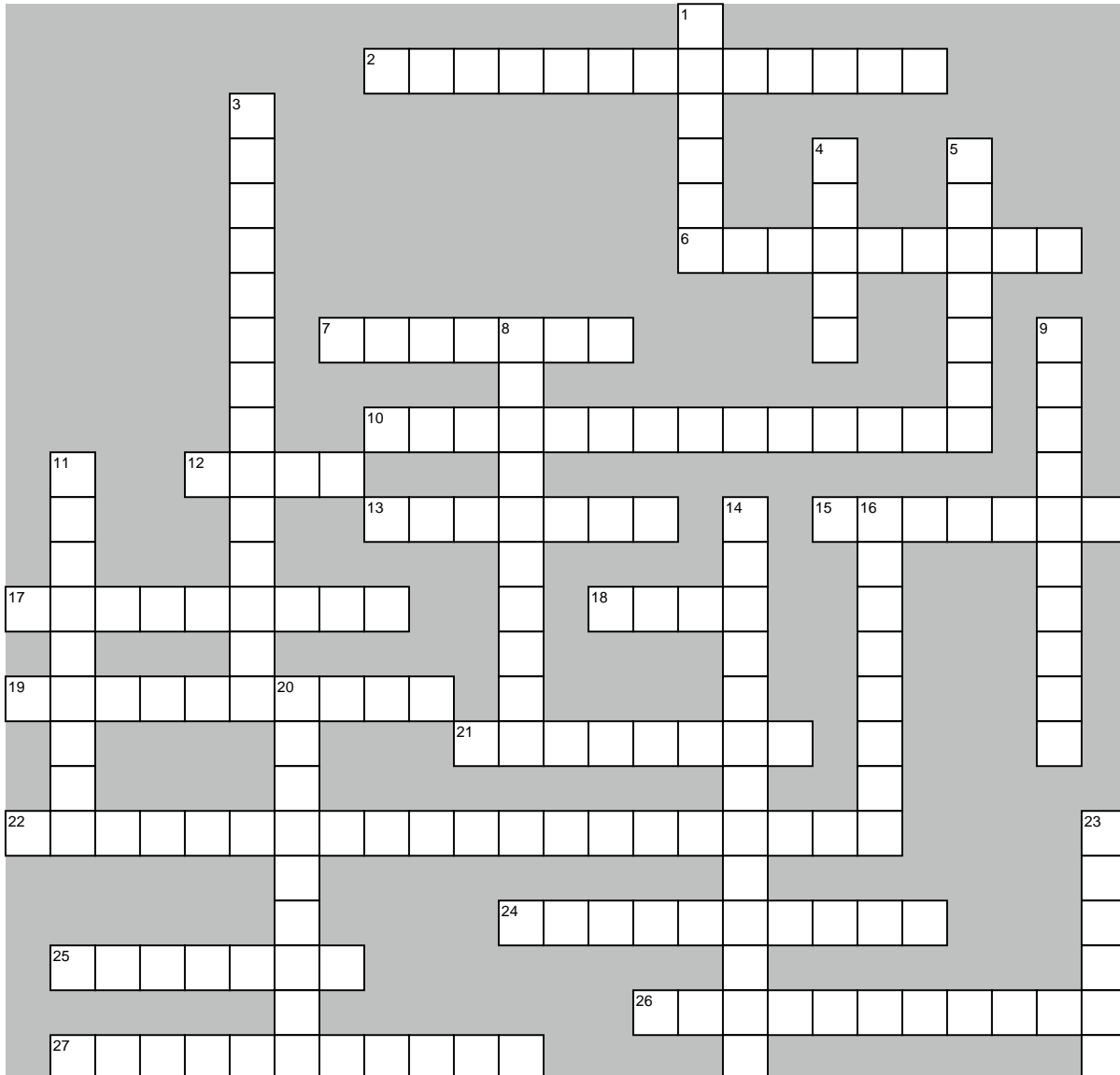

ACROSS

- 2 parents combine practices from two other parenting styles to direct children's behavior and attitudes
- 6 a secondary prevention activity
- 7 family or household that includes at least one stepparent, stepsibling, or half-sibling
- 10 implies that the nurse must consider relationships between family members as well as to their own environment
- 12 [blank] is an increased probability of developing a disease, injury, or illness.
- 13 position in the birth order of children that affects their personalities

- 14 parents who try to control their children's behavior and attitudes through unquestioned mandates
- 16 describes the interaction of family members, especially the quality of those relationships and interactions
- 20 prevention that focuses on screening and early diagnosis
